# GUIDELINES REGARDING THE CURFEW ENACTED FRIDAY, MARCH 20, 2020

• Curfew extends from 10:00 PM – 6:00 AM for all non- work related movement in Graham County.

# WHAT?

ALL MOVEMENT WITHIN THE COUNTY

### WHY?

- Preserve public safety resources for true public safety emergencies.
- Protection of health care resources, especially our front line medical workers.
- Flatten the COVID19 curve so that hospitals are not stressed beyond their capacity.

- Limiting face to face contact to encourage social distancing. The COVID 19 virus is highly contagious and limiting face to face contact within 6 feet could save your life or the life of someone you love.
- You could have no symptoms of COVID -19 and still infect someone else!
- Protect your friends and family members, especially the most vulnerable persons above 65 years old, persons with diabetes, heart disease, chronic asthma, or under treatment for autoimmune diseases and cancer.
- o Possibly protect and preserve your life or someone's life whom you care about.

### WHO MUST COMPLY?

- Anyone who is NOT an emergency first responder (Law Enforcement, EMS, 911 Call Center, Fire and Rescue).
- Persons who must travel and move within the county due to work are exempt from the curfew to
  fulfill their work related responsibilities. Employers should be prepared to provide a letter to
  employees required out during the curfew or employer provided identification for employees in the
  event they are questioned by law enforcement.
- Gas Stations and Convenience stores selling gas will be permitted to operate during curfew hours to
  enable workers requiring movement during curfew hours to re-fuel and get needed work provisions.

# WHAT IF I DON'T COMPLY?

- You will be stopped by law enforcement.
- You could be subject to civil penalties.
